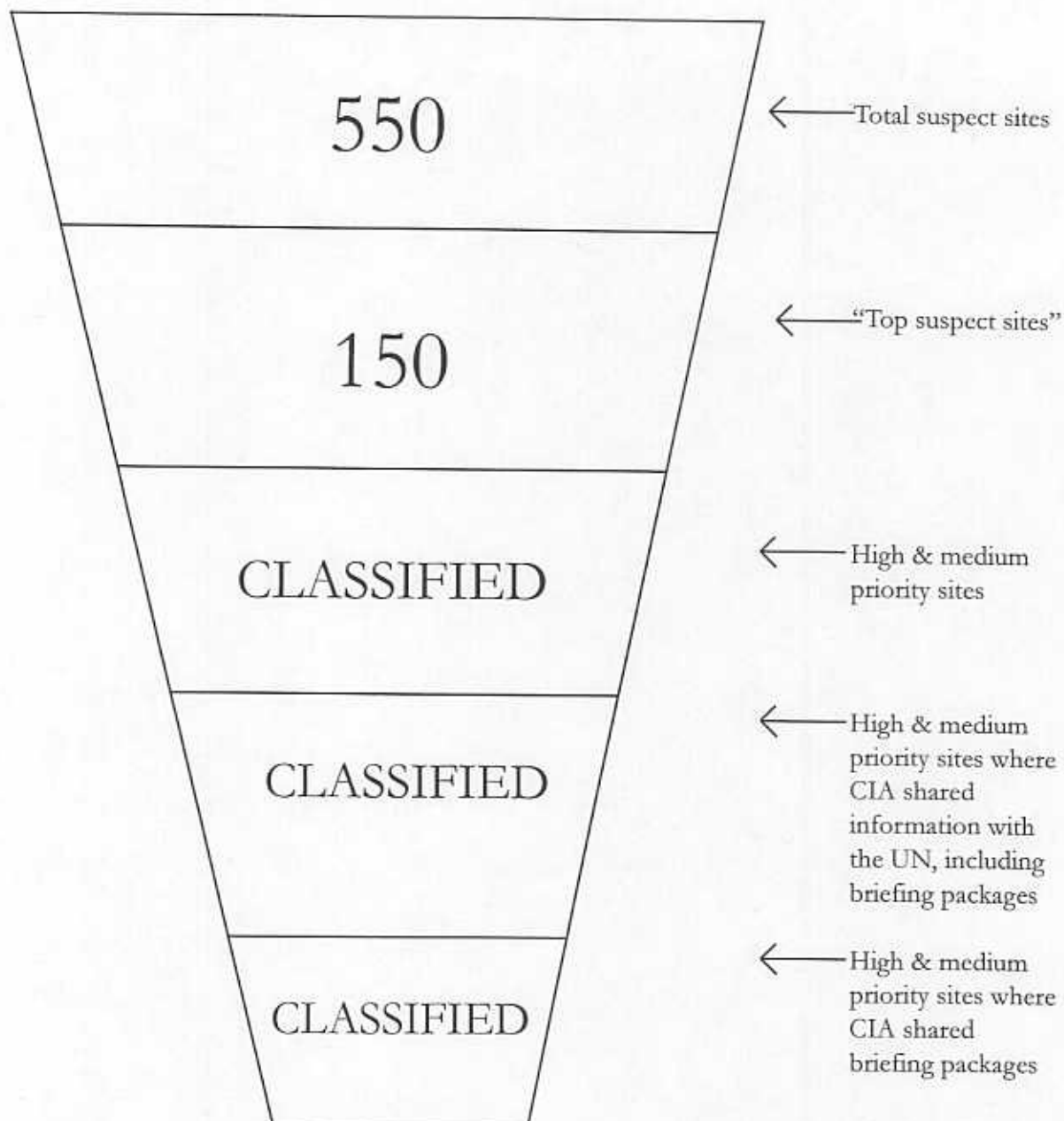

Letter from DCI George Tenet to Senator Carl Levin  
May 23, 2003

"Regarding declassifying the chart . . . we continue to have a close relationship with UN inspection organizations, including the IAEA, and confidentiality remains an important foundation of our maintaining successful relationships with international organizations. Dr. Blix has been quite reserved in his public comments on his various liaison relationships, respecting our secrecy arrangements, and we should abide by those understandings as well. By releasing data on our support for UNMOVIC we risk undermining our credibility with other international organizations with whom we continue to interact."
